Home-Start helps families with young children deal with whatever life throws at them. We support parents as they learn to cope, improve their confidence, and build better lives for their children. The benefit of our support include improved health and well-being and better family relationships

What goes on inside a family determines the opportunities and life chances children have. Children who are raised in a stable, loving, family environment are more likely to have a positive and healthy future. But being a parent isn't easy, and sometimes life can get in the way. Circumstances throw you off course and everything else can take a back seat. A young child caught up in this can miss out on the love, routine and stimulation that are so vital for their future. We recruit, train and support volunteers, so that they can be matched to families referred by other professionals. Volunteers visit the family's home for a couple of hours every week, the support is tailored to the needs of the parents and children and usually lasts up to 6 months. We work alongside parents to help them to regain their confidence, helping them to be the best they can be. There's no judgement, just compassionate, confidential help and support. We only support families that live within the Kettering Area and we work closely with Midwives, health visitors, nurseries and schools as well as housing, Social Care and Health and other Statutory Services

Measures which improve mental health and wellbeing Last year, 92% of the adults and children within the 90 families that we supported said that having Home-Start involved improved theirs and/or their childrens mental health. 97% said that they felt happier and more self-confident in their role as a parent and reported better family relationships. Having the security of core funding allows us to focus on service delivery rather than constantly applying for grants, and so this application will also support the final objective

We only employ 1 full time manager and 1x 25hr office administrator. This grant will be used to support 250 staff hours. 		
How will you measure the impact of the project?	All referrals are assessed by a paid worker who then assigns the most appropriate volunteer, taking into account the skills that each volunteer brings. The support is then reviewed after approximately 6 weeks to ensure that it is effective and then again after 6 months. We aim to end support after 6 months so as not to create a dependency We are able to really get to the heart of the problem and if we cannot provide the help (because it is too specialist) we can take the family to the service that they need and guide and support them through any process necessary to get that support.

The Community Garden will achieve our aims in a practical manner by growing our own vegetables and creating a haven for biodiversity. We will teach through hands on demonstrations and encourage people to join in and freely take our harvests. We also intend to create a Reflection/Serenity Garden for people to have a quiet space. We will offer this for use by local agencies working with people in need. This is to be build at the back of All Saints Church in an area (max 300 words). that was once used as a nursery play area. The intention of this part of the Garden is to create a calming space. Complete with raised flower/tree beds incorporating seating areas, potted trees, grasses, a solar powered water feature, fruit bushes and further seating areas. The area has two entrances, through low metal gates. These, coupled with the garden being behind the church give this part of the garden a feeling of security and shelter from a busy outside world.

Members of the Church's congregation, who are mostly elderly, have expressed their delight that there will be an area for them to sit, relax and pass a few hours in peace and calm. However, as we are not affiliated with the church, but rather work with them, we intend to open this out to other local agencies.

The ultimate aim of the garden is to allow the garden to be used for counselling by other agencies with people they support on one-to-one basis. This will take the counselling out of the formal office settings and give the sessions a more serene and neutral environment.

In this way we will reach more of the residents of Kettering and increase the capacity of charitable agencies.

Currently the area is covered by a rubber outdoor playground material. We need to take this up and cover with suitable Garden Gravel. We believe the best gravel will be Cotswold Chippings due to their neutral tones which is calming.


We will also need to create a pathway through the gravel for accessibility and extend an existing paved area, again for greater accessibility. The paving used will be Red Block Paving to match the existing paved area.

How will you measure the impact of the project?	The first initial measurement will the amount of times the garden is visited and the requests we receive for its use. We will strenuously offer this garden for use by other agencies as well as our own volunteers to maximize its capacity.
	We will follow up each visit to gauge the impact it had on the well-being of those who used it and will use this feedback to constantly improve the site.
	We raised £1067.97 through a fund raising event for the garden, to be used towards the plants and fixtures. This has shown us that there is a wider community support for our group and its aims of building the Reflection/Serenity Garden.

Our main role is to tackle food poverty within our local community, relying purely on donations. Kettering Foodbank benefits the community by providing food parcels to those experiencing a financial crisis containing basic yet essential items alongside fresh/frozen food, toiletries and baby items upon request. Our help extends to various groups of people with individuals, couples and families all struggling in these difficult times. Following a telephone consultation people are offered help in the form of these food parcels but are also given financial and budgeting advice encouraging them to contact further organisations in order to better their circumstances.

YOUR APPLICATION OR PROJECT

This funding would help massively in allowing us to pay our underlying costs including our rent and electrics which is something that hinders our ability to purchase food items. Currently we are having to buy food ourselves as relying on donations is unfortunately causing the shelves to run bare given the unprecedented nature of demand we are experiencing. Receiving this funding would mean we could ensure that our food parcels contain everything people would need which is extremely important especially in relation to families with children who deserve to receive complete meals. Having fully stocked shelves will benefit every person we encounter as the help they receive will be of a higher standard. In terms of geographical area, we cover all of Kettering with our services broadening to surrounding areas. With help of our van (which also requires running costs such as fuel) we are able to get to those who lack transport extending our reach. As an independent charity we work primarily alone in terms of our immediate work however we have contact and receive referrals from various organisations including S2S, Job centre, Schools, Social services and Armed Forces

charities to name a few. These organisations rely on our help to support those individuals they work with therefore being able to ensure we are physically able to help these people remains a priority for us. Other organisations we also work with include FareShare who deliver fresh goods to us on a weekly basis and local supermarkets in which customers give donations which we collect. These organisations all support our work however we will not be directly working with them in terms of our project which centres around funding our rent and continuation of online food orders to maintain stock levels.

How will you measure the impact of the project?	Monthly, figures are calculated and reflected upon so our volunteers and trustees are able to comprehend the amount of people which have been helped in terms of physical people and meals provided. Measuring the impact of this project will be done in a similar manner whereby the number of individuals, couples and families will be recorded in order to judge whether the demand has remained constant or fluctuated. Among the trustees there will be discussions surrounding the quality of the parcels, should funding be received, to ensure that they are varied, balanced and suitable for those in desperate need. There should be an improvement on the completeness of parcels and this will be evidenced through a checklist which is used by all volunteers who make up parcels.
