2024/022	Policing, Crime and anti-social behaviour						
	Inspector Matt Rock, accompanied by sergeants Hollie Callaghan and Mark Walsh attended the meeting to update on recent police activity and planned engagement activities with local residents. The crime and ASB statistics for the year to date were provided. These showed sustained drops in crime levels and in ASB incidents.						
	 Councillors asked about The incidence of sexual offences and what the police were doing to engage with young people in particular The prospect of evening SB in the town centre increasing over the summer and how this could be pre-empted. The police had not yet had the offered contact from the Royal Hotel to discuss use of their premises. 						
2024/023	Accommodation Concern						
	John Perry from Accommodation Concern addressed members and outlined the work of Accommodation Concern and the profile of clients and their concerns. Benefits work not exceeded housing and debt inquiries. It was proving harder to maintain engagement with some clients experiencing mental health issues but the overall proportion of clients with mental health needs had increased significantly. John also acknowledged the support from the Town Council.						
2024/024	Financial Regulations						
	A report was submitted which sought approval for a new set of financial regulations. The new regulations took into account the recent publication of a national model set of rules, and responded to recommendations from the internal auditor to develop a bad debts policy, and to enhance the detail in the asset register. Finally, new spending limits were proposed to reflect the impact of inflation on the existing provisions. The bad debts policy wording had bene considered and agreed already by the Finance and Governance Committee.						
	Members considered the inclusion of paragraph 3.6 which required councillors in debt for council tax arrears to declare this and not take part in decisions about the Council's budget and precept. Given the						



difficulty in enforcement of this provision, it was agreed to seek the views of the NNC Monitoring officer on the inclusion of the clause.

RESOLVED that approval be given to

- a) The proposed text of the financial regulations as set out in Appendix One to the report, with the exception of clause 3.6, pending the views of the NNC Monitoring Officer
- b) The debt write off policy as set out in paragraph 9 of the regulations
- c) The new requirements on the details of the asset register as set out in paragraph 14 of the regulations
- d) Changes in the quotations and tendering procedure triggers as set out in paragraph 11 of the regulations
- e) Changes to the limits on spending under emergency powers and the use of the Council's payment card
- f) Corresponding changes to Standing Orders to reflect (d) above
- g) The appointment of Cllr Maggie Don to conduct bank reconciliation with the clerk each month.

2024/025 | Events Policy Statement

A report was submitted which sought approval for the adoption of an Events Policy Statement. This brought together into a single document the Council's aims and objectives for providing events, its policy and practice and the standards to which it would operate. It built on the experience of the last two years and sought to capture all the Council's related policies.

Members continued to show their appreciation of the work to provide the events programme

2024/026	Central Kettering Neighbourhood Plan								
	A report was submitted which asked Council to agree on the extent of the proposed neighbourhood plan for the central area of Kettering and to make an application to the planning authority to designate the intended area accordingly. The report outlined the options the Council had and summarised the discussion at the workshop held on 12 th June. Members agreed that a designated area to which the plan's policies would apply should nevertheless involve engaging the whole community across town in its design given the centrality of the town centre to the plans coverage								
	RESOLVED that								
	a) North Northamptonshire Council be asked to designate the area shown in gold and purple on the plan included within the report as a Neighbourhood Plan Area entitled "Central Kettering Neighbourhood Plan"								
	b) That the community engagement for the development of this Neighbourhood Plan be designed so that it seeks to inform and engage residents of the whole town, in anticipation that all residents may be entitled to vote in an eventual referendum
